Recall Page

Vocabulary

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Run of prints	A number of copies that are printed at one time
Accuracy	Precision or correctness when producing or repeating a print.
Block printing	A method of printing where a print is carved into a surface and the print can be repeated.
Mono printing	A method of printing where the image can only be made once.
Inks	A colour mixed with oil that is applied to a print surface.
Combine	Applying one or more print to create a single image
Centralise	To align a print to the central point of the page, measuring margins for accuracy.
Overprint	Printing colours/prints directly over others causing the colours or images to mix.
Recessed	The areas removed from a lino/block that will be the negative space.

Knowledge

I will need to know:


- A range of printing techniques
- The material suited to different types of printing
- How colours can be used to create effects in printing
- Different effects of intaglio and relief prints
- How to combine relief and intaglio printing
- How to centralise paper to ensure the print is the same
- How to overprint repeating patterns
